




Duquesne University Campus Map July 1, 2010







Duquesne University Enrollment History - Headcount Fall Semesters 1985-2009











Duquesne University Enrollment by State of Residency Fall Semester 2009






Duquesne University National Enrollment Map Fall Semester 2009





Duquesne University Glossary of Terms 2010 Fact Book

Academic Program	An instructional program leading to a bachelor's, master's, doctoral or first-professional degree or resulting in credits that can be applied to one of these degrees.
Academic Level	A classification which includes Freshman (FR), Sophomore (SO), Junior (JR) and Senior (SR), as well as Undergraduate (UG), Graduate (GR), First Professional (FP) and other special classes.
Academic Rank	A system that classifies faculty. Includes professor, associate professor, assistant professor and instructor.
Academic Year	The year beginning with the fall semester and ending at the conclusion of the following spring semester.
Accreditation	Approval to an institution of learning by an official review board after the school has met specific requirements.
<u>Certificate</u>	A formal award presented at the completion of a post-secondary, post-baccalaureate, or post-master's academic program.
College Code	A code corresponding to a particular school.
<u>Credit Hour</u>	A unit of measure representing an hour (50 minutes) of instruction per week over a semester.
<u>Default Rate</u>	The percentage of a school's federal student loan borrowers who enter repayment within the cohort fiscal year and default (or met other specified condition) within the cohort default period.
<u>Degree</u>	An award conferred by Duquesne University as recognition for the successful completion of an academic program.
Enrollment Status	All students enrolled are either classified as full-time (FT) or part-time (PT) depending upon their individual credit load, academic level, and academic program.
Fall Semester	(or Spring Semester), a fifteen week period that is part of the academic year.
First Professional	A degree requiring at least six years of college work to complete, among other criteria. At Duquesne University, the Law (JD) and Pharmacy (PharmD) are first professional programs.
Fiscal Year	For Duquesne University, the year beginning July 1 and ending June 30.
Full Time Equivalent	(FTE) a measure of enrollment, usually calculated by dividing undergraduate credits by 15 and graduate credits by 12, per US and PA Departments of Education guidelines.
Instructional Faculty	Those members of the instruction/research staff whose major regular assignment is instruction.
Joint Program	An academic program that includes all or most of the requirements of two unique academic programs administered by two of the University's schools. Two unique degrees are awarded.
<u>Major</u>	An area of academic focus, when combined with a degree, yields an academic program.
Non-Resident Alien	A person who is not a citizen or national of the United States, and does not have the right to remain here indefinitely.
<u>Race</u>	The ethnicity self-identified by the student or employee. This classification is set by the US Dept. of Education and includes: Black/non-Hispanic, American Indian/Alaskan Native, Asian/Pacific Islander, White/non-Hispanic, or Hispanic.
<u>School</u>	An academic unit responsible for the collection of academic programs within that school. At Duquesne University, there are ten schools, each headed by a Dean.
Site	A code that identifies the location where the student is enrolled in courses.
Student Attribute	A code used at Duquesne University to identify unique groups of students.
