






































Duquesne University Unrestricted Operating Revenues and Expenses

Operating Expenses \$256,880



Unrestricted Operating Revenue and Expense Fiscal Years Ended June 30 (in thousands)







Significant Events in Duquesne University History

1878 (Oct.)	Pittsburgh Catholic School of the Holy Ghost opened its doors First enrollment was 40 students
1878	College and Graduate School of Liberal Arts established
1882	State charter was granted for Pittsburgh Catholic School
1885	"Old Main" dedicated, the first building at the University's current location
1889	First baccalaureate degree conferred
1904	University Chapel dedicated
1910	Became The University of the Holy Ghost, the first Catholic University in Pennsylvania
1911	Renamed Duquesne University of The Holy Ghost
1911	School of Law established
1913	School of Business Administration established
1925	School of Pharmacy established
1926	School of Music established
1929	School of Education established
1937	School of Nursing established
1981	Enrollment reaches 6,744
1984	Creation of Honors College
1987	University Mission Statement approved by Board of Directors
1990	School of Health Sciences established
1994	Enrollment grows to 9,000 students
1994	School of Natural and Environmental Sciences established
2002	Filed name change with PA Corporation Bureau to become Duquesne University of The Holy Spirit
2006	First time enrollment exceeds 10,000 students
2013	University celebrates a history of 135 years
2013	School of Business celebrates its centennial

Duquesne University Glossary of Terms 2014 Fact Book

FACT BOOK TERMS:

An instructional program leading to a bachelor's, master's, doctoral or professional practice degree

or resulting in credits that can be applied to one of these degrees.

Academic Level A classification which includes Freshman (FR), Sophomore (SO), Junior (JR) and Senior (SR), as well as

Undergraduate (UG), Graduate (GR), Professional Practice and other special classes.

Academic Rank

A system that classifies faculty. Includes professor, associate professor, assistant professor and instructor.

Academic Year

The year beginning with the fall semester and ending at the conclusion of the following spring semester.

Accreditation Approval to an institution of learning by an official review board after the school has met specific requirements.

Certificate A formal award presented at the completion of a post-secondary, post-baccalaureate, or post-master's academic

program

<u>Credit Hour</u> A unit of measure representing an hour (50 minutes) of instruction per week over a semester.

<u>Default Rate</u> The percentage of a school's federal student loan borrowers who enter repayment within the cohort fiscal year

and default (or met other specified condition) within the cohort default period.

<u>Degree</u> An award conferred by Duquesne University as recognition for the successful completion of an academic program.

Enrollment Status All students enrolled are either classified as full-time (FT) or part-time (PT) depending upon their individual

credit load, academic level, and academic program.

<u>Fall Semester</u> (or Spring Semester), a fifteen week period that is part of the academic year.

Professional Practice A doctor's degree that is conferred upon completion of a program providing the knowledge and skills for the recognition, credential,

or license required for professional practice. At Duquesne University, the Law (JD), Pharmacy (PharmD), Physical Therapy (DPT),

and Nursing (DNP) are categorized as Professional Practice programs.

Law (JD) and Pharmacy (PharmD) were formerly classified as "First-Professional ".

<u>Fiscal Year</u> For Duquesne University, the year beginning July 1 and ending June 30.

Full Time Equivalent (FTE) a measure of enrollment, calculated by dividing undergraduate credits by 15 and graduate credits by

12.

Instructional Faculty Those members of the instruction/research faculty whose primary assignment is instruction.

Joint Program An academic program that includes all or most of the requirements of two unique academic programs administered

by two of the University's schools. Two unique degrees are awarded.

<u>Major</u> An area of academic focus, when combined with a degree, yields an academic program.

Non-Resident Alien A person who is not a citizen or national of the United States, and does not have the right to remain here indefinitely.

Race/Ethnicity The categories developed in 1997 by the Office of Management and Budget (OMB) do not denote scientific definitions of anthropological origins. The

designations are used to categorize U.S. citizens, resident aliens, and other non-eligible citizens. Individuals are asked to first designate ethnicity as: Hispanic or Latino OR Not Hispanic or Latino. Second, individuals are asked to indicate all races that apply among the following: American Indian or Alaska

Native, Asian, Black or African American, Native Hawaiian or Other Pacific Islander or White.

School An academic unit responsible for the collection of academic programs within that school. At Duquesne University,

there are ten schools, each headed by a Dean.

Site A code that identifies the location where the student is enrolled in courses.

Student Attribute A code used at Duquesne University to identify unique groups of students.
